Historic Categories of Funding

ENVIRONMENTAL SUPPORT:
PACT'S ENVIRONMENTAL
SUPPORT GRANTS PROVIDE
FUNDING TO COMMUNITY
BASED GROUPS. MAXIMUM
FUNDING ALLOTMENT IS
BZ\$10,000

EXTRAORDINARY FUNDING:
THESE GRANT TYPES REFER TO
ANY REQUEST OUTSIDE OF THE
INVESTMENT/GRANT CYCLE. AN
EXTRAORDINARY FUNDING
REQUEST MUST BE FOR A PERIOD
OF NO MORE THAN
ONE YEAR (12 MONTHS)
